HOW CAN ONE PERSON MAKE A DIFFERENCE? NAPA HUMANE'S POWER OF ONE CAMPAIGN

Napa Humane is harnessing the power of social networking to help the Napa Valley realize its potential as a progressive and safe haven for companion animals.

HOW? We are launching a new virtual campaign called the **Power of One**. The Power of One **extends our reach to new donor/advocates** and generates funds in an easy, comfortable and barrier free format through social media.

The Power of One is a **grassroots, word-of-mouth movement** that runs May through the end of June. From the comfort and convenience of their homes, offices, or mobile phones, each Napa Humane fundraiser will be able to **reach out to their social network** and share the link of their personal Power of One web page.

Friends, family, neighbors, and colleagues of the fundraisers can donate online in a safe and completely secure environment. Moreover, donors can leverage their own social network and pass along Napa Humane and Power of One campaign information with a simple click.

It's simple, personal, direct and easy. The virtual nature of the Power of One campaign allows Napa Humane to extend our reach, build our community, and raise funds for our 2010 initiatives in a cost effective manner.

The strength behind this campaign is that one person can make the difference in the lives of our community's animals who will reach out to another who will reach out to yet one more...**that's the Power of One.**



Every day, we are honored with the kindness and dedication of volunteers giving not only their time, but also their hearts, to the many activities that help us to serve the thousands of animals in need of the programs of Napa Humane. Holly Evans is one of those treasured volunteers.

Holly supports our organization with a steadfast devotion to mobile adoption events, the "Cause for the Paws" annual fundraiser, writing newsletter articles and press materials, and being at the ready to volunteer wherever needed, whenever her schedule will allow.

Originally from Southern California, Holly moved to the Napa Valley in 1998 after accepting a position at a local winery. A huge animal advocate, Holly first heard about the "Cause for the Paws" event in 2005 from a friend and decided to volunteer. She was immediately "hooked" and wanted to branch out to help in other areas as well.

"After the event, I came to deeply respect the mission of Napa Humane and wanted to assist in whatever way I could. I found that I most enjoyed working directly with animals via the Mobile Adoption Unit." Holly has witnessed firsthand how valuable the adoption unit is, noting, "It's very important to get out into the community to educate people about Napa Humane and its mission and encourage people to adopt from the Napa County Animal Shelter whenever possible. Doing so can literally save the life of a wonderful companion animal."

Holly has many hobbies and interests such as scuba diving, reading and hiking. But until very recently, her absolute favorite way to spend time was with her cherished animal companion Jasper, who passed away suddenly in late January. Jasper, a lab mix, was adopted by Holly over 12 years ago after being abandoned in a vineyard with three tiny litter mates. One of Holly's coworkers took the puppies home and alerted her of the situation, reporting that one of the puppies (soon to be Jasper) had a broken leg.

Holly immediately responded to the call for help by purchasing food and other items to help care for the puppies. When she arrived and saw Jasper's happy face and wagging tail despite his pain, she fell in love immediately; she knew she had found a lifelong friend.

Jasper's veterinarian told Holly that the pup was only about three weeks old and that his leg was too badly injured to make a full recovery but, she joyfully notes, "That didn't slow him down. He loved long walks at Alston and Kennedy Parks and especially loved to swim. On several occasions, he went looking for me in the ocean on a scuba dive. He would swim in circles around the exact spot where my dive buddy and I had descended."

Though Jasper's passing has been difficult, Holly reflects on their time together with love and happiness. "Since the moment Jasper came into my life, he was my constant companion and dearest friend. It was always a joy to come home at the end of the day and be greeted with such love. Although I miss him terribly, I am so very grateful for the time we had together."


